

# Protect Danish poultry!



## Did you know?

There is a risk that one introduce Avian Influenza to Danish poultry from infected birds in other European countries? Currently there are outbreaks in several European countries.



## Disease transmission



Infection can be transmitted from other birds or from feed or water containing virus. It is possible to carry Avian Influenza virus in clothes, footwear, feed sacks, infected hatching eggs, tools, machines, boxes, vehicles etc.

## If you arrive from countries with disease outbreak

You must not enter a poultry facility in Denmark if you have been to an outbreak area. If you have been to a country with outbreak and are in Denmark to collect, catch or caretake poultry, or to install equipment at a poultry facility, then it is of highest importance to meet the quarantine requirements (48 hours) prior to your entrance at the poultry facility. Do not bring food into Denmark – not even for your own consumption!



## Hygiene



All vehicles, trailers, boxes and equipment brought to Denmark must be washed prior to arrival in Denmark.

You must always remember to change to clean clothes, socks and footwear, and wash and disinfect your hands before you enter a poultry facility. Always apply with the rules laid down by the farmer/owner

## Hunters

Have you been hunting in countries with outbreak of Avian Influenza? Then it is important that you meet the quarantine rules after you return to Denmark. Remember to clean your boots after each hunt, before dropping them in your car. Do not bring your dog for hunts in countries with Avian Influenza outbreak. Apply hand disinfectant during hunting and after contact with game.
