Do you protect your birds?

Do you know?

There is a risk of transmission of Avian Influenza from wild birds. It is of highest importance that you protect your own birds.





Remember

In case of birds with unexplainable illness or high mortality rates your flock must be inspected by a veterinarian. It is statutory to report any suspicion of Avian Influenza.



Biosecurity

Protect your birds – change footwear and wash your hands before and after visiting your birds. Keep your facilities clean and tidy to avoid rodents. Contact rodent control if you experience signs of their activity.



Feeding and watering

Limit the number of wild birds in your outdoor area by complying with following rules:


- Feed and water under roof
- Cover water basins
- Do not water with surface water or water from water collection

Anseriformes (ducks) and gallinaceans (hens) must be kept separated to avoid disease transmission.
